PROJECT OVERVIEW

ABOUT THE HOSPITAL:

The hospital you'll most likely work in is fairly new, having been established in 2011. It also operates an NGO that focuses its efforts in 40 communities in the Okakoi Sub metro of Accra. They raise awareness about the prevention and management of Malaria, TB, HIV and Non-communicable diseases such as hypertension and diabetes.



In addition to providing health care services, the hospital is training the next generation of nurses. They are committed to training them using international standards in patient care and infection prevention and control as well as teaching them using a patient-centred approach. Their goal is to be able to invest in health care equipment, such as kidney dialysis machines that will allow them to serve Ghanaians at home as opposed to having to send them abroad for treatment.

There are five health care clinics and hospitals under the Group of Companies which you might get the chance to work at during your placement.

Facilities

At time of writing, medical services available at the hospital include:

Antenatal: The hospital has several experienced and compassionate midwives who get to know their patients well enough to make them feel comfortable when they come in to give birth. The hospital holds antenatal clinics every Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:30 am to 4:30pm

Emergency Care: The Hospital is able to perform emergency care with qualified doctors and nurses who will be able to take the necessary steps to stabilize a patient and transfer them if necessary.

24 Hour Ambulance Services: The hospital operates two full equipped ambulances for emergency calls and transfers.

Laboratory:

There is a laboratory which can perform series of pathological tests such as:

- · Serological test
- Microbiological test
- · Chemistry test
- Haematological test

Pharmacy: The pharmacy is open 24/7, dispensing drugs as well as providing advice on how to take the medications and answering any questions patients might have.

Reflexology and Physiotherapy: The hospital currently have one reflexologist who has more than 10 years of experience. Reflexology is an alternative medicine that involves providing physical pressure to the feet or palm with specific thumb, finger and hand techniques.

Theatre: There are currently has two fully equipped surgery theatres. The hospital is able to perform general surgeries and orthopaedic surgeon.

Other departments at the hospital include:

- OPD
- USG Scan
- Surgeries
- Internal Medicine
- Obstetrics and Gynaecology
- · Billing and Coding

WORK CONTENT

Ghanaian law follows Common Law, which is based on the British system. Each day is different with new and interesting cases coming through and thus neither we nor the Centre can say exactly what you will be doing daily. However expect to deal with different tasks from day to day.

There will be opportunities to get involved in current legal issues, both through dealing directly with clients and researching broader cases. You will be able to learn how to deal with clients and get an insight into everyday life in a legal office. The types of work you could be doing includes:

- Working on research projects or writing articles about current topics and human rights issues
- Writing content for the Centre's website
- Court trips
- Organising Seminars and Workshops
- Trips outside of Accra for fact-finding, seminars and workshops
- Assisting staff members in their day to day activities
- If you have a case of your own you will be able to interview clients, write letters and notifications concerning the cases or have appointments, for example, at Court.

WORK HOURS

The Hospital is very busy and consults many patients per day. You'll get an induction on your first day/s at the hospital. You'll be introduced to the local staff and departments and arrangements will be made for your timetable. You'll be involved in the day-to-day running of the centre, observing the doctors and nurses where you can help out in simple but practical ways, vastly increasing your own knowledge and understanding of medical practice.

You may be involved in general nursing duties, such as checking of temperature, blood pressure, general health care as well as laboratory duties, dispensing of drugs etc. You'll do each department per week, depending on the duration of your program and, if you're there long enough, you'll get to cover all departments.

If you plan on specialising in a particular field of medicine, we can try to arrange to place you in your relevant department, to ensure that you receive maximum experience in your chosen field.

Your work schedule may vary week by week depending on how busy the hospital is and where help is need the most at the time that you're there. You'll start work at about 8.00 a.m. or earlier, depending on the engagement with a do

IMPORTANT: THIS PROJECT IS OBSERVATIONAL ONLY

This project is observation only – by law you cannot participate in or assist with patient care and/or any other activity which could put you and/or any other person at risk. However, if you're qualified, you may be able to assist far more. In order to do this, you would first need to be in possession of the required qualifications, have the necessary experience to go with your qualifications, be registered for practising in Ghana, be registered at the medical centre/hospital and be insured to practise in Ghana. Without these legally required criteria, you won't be able to participate in any treatment of patients. You will of course be able watch and comment on the proceedings, and you'll usually finish at 4.00 p.m. Break time is at 12:30 for an hour.



WHAT IS REQUIRED OF YOU ... AND GHANAIAN TIME!

Self-reliance, independence and initiative are highly appreciated and a sense of humour when the electricity fails, or buses don't turn up, will help you to make the most of this wonderful opportunity!

Like all our destination countries, the culture in Ghana is different to what you're used to. For example, the people are exceptionally friendly and helpful, with big smiles and a relaxed attitude. On the other hand, the living standard falls short of UK or Western standards. And **Ghanaian time** is when someone says, "See you at 10.a.m." - what he really means is, "I'll see you sometime tomorrow" ... And then he may not turn up at all. The pace of life is slower and more relaxed, but you'll quickly get involved in the daily life of the local people and pretty soon you'll feel completely at home - Ghana has that effect on you!

Working in the health sector in the developing world is a real challenge, but the experience you gain will be invaluable to you in the future and totally different to what you're used to in your home country, and will be an excellent entry on your CV or Résumé

ACCOMMODATION

ACCOMMODATION

Your accommodation will vary depending on your work location, but will either be in a family run hostel or with a host family. This means that you get to eat, sleep, work, socialise and generally live like a Ghanaian. This enables you to fully experience the local culture from the inside.

Many of our volunteers remain friends with their host families long after they leave Ghana and in some cases they return to the country later especially to visit their family. Sometimes members of their Ghanaian family have even gone to visit them in their home country.

FOOD

Food is included in this placement and will be local cuisine - again this is to enable you to fully experience living as local Ghanaians do. When we arrange your placement, we will liaise



extensively with you regarding both the placement and your accommodation. As always, our Local Manager will look after you well and will always be on hand to help and offer advice.
