Assist in a school in Cape Town that has many children from previously disadvantaged backgrounds. The majority of the children come from townships in the surrounding area.

You'll work with children ranging from 5 to 13 years old. You can teach **English** and **language enrichment**, as well as coaching **Sports**, teaching **Music**, **Art**, **Computers**, or any other subject that you have particular knowledge in.

You may also be involved with **The SHINE Centre** – (Support and Help in Education), which also runs from the school. This is a volunteer programme with local and international volunteers who assist their learners with numeracy and literacy.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Work in <u>Cape Town</u> in a junior school with approximately 600 children, with 20 teachers. The average class size is between 28 and 40 and sometimes classes will be split into smaller groups when you are assisting. You may be needed to take small groups of children or individuals out of the class and work with them privately, helping with reading lessons in the library.

Classes tend to last between 30 - 60 minutes. Standards are generally very high and the enthusiasm of the students and colleagues is infectious.

The school mainly caters for the poorer African children that

come from the township areas of Cape Town. These are the neediest and make up 98% of the school's children. The school is multi-cultured and multi-racial and mainly has children at the school between 5 - 13 years of age. English is not the children's mother tongue, but their general standard of language is about Fair to Good. You can also coach sports as well as English teaching and language enrichment, music, art, computers or any other subject that you have particular knowledge in.

This Centre has been running for approximately 10 years and is fully sponsored. Volunteers interact with learners on a one-to-one basis according to the times and days that the volunteers are available. They interact with the same learner/s throughout the year.

SHINE is an excellent outreach programme and they always welcome new volunteers to give their assistance. You'll have the opportunity to get involved in this programme if you wish to, in addition to the main stream teaching assistance. The students have a never-ending enthusiasm and energy, which is amazing considering the hardships they may experience at home.

This project is not available during school holidays. Therefore, please compare the above school term dates to the dates of your placement. If a holiday falls during your placement, you should use this time to do any independent travelling and sightseeing. Generally the last week before terms end is given to exams and tests. This means that you will generally find your work load dropping during this week and you will usually find more free time than normal school time.

ACCOMMODATION

Nestled under the mountain near the city, is the trendy and arty suburb of Observatory, the student Mecca of Cape Town. We have chosen this location as an accommodation base and make use of a backpacker's lodge, where you will be staying. Its distance from the projects, safety conscious attitude and very friendly staff make this the ideal home away from home.

South African backpackers are unique and majority are run as a 'home away from home' in large houses, with always lots of space to relax and watch TV, read a book, or just sit by the pool and soak in the sun.

In Observatory, we use The Green Elephant backpacker's lodge, which has been running since 1994 and is spaced across 3 beautiful houses. The main house consists of dormitory style rooms, free unlimited wireless internet, a festive bar, a braai (BBQ) area and a swimming pool. The other two houses have private rooms (single and double rooms).



The lodge is situated in the heart of Observatory and a short (5 minute) stroll away from a large supermarket, internet café, restaurants, coffee shops, pharmacy and laundromat. The lodge is also closely situated to the main road, where busses and taxis are available literally at your doorstep.

You'll be staying in a dorm-style room in the main house, which consist of 6 beds each. The mattresses are great and all linen and towels are provided, but it's a good idea to bring your own beach towel. There is a laundry self-service area available at the lodge for R15/load (about £1), but there are also laundromats a few minutes' walk away that will wash, dry and fold for you.

The lodge has a 24-hour reception desk, and they pride themselves with long-term staff of up to 20 years. This translates into a safe environment with experienced staff, who are able to offer the best local advice to guests for trips & tours, restaurants and basically any local information on the Cape Town area.

The Green Elephant is also committed to low impact and sustainable tourism to preserve our natural beauty for future generations. They recycle everything from water (in grey water systems) to bottles, paper and plastic, which we strongly support!

FOOD:

You'll be given a food budget which will cover your basic essentials (but not extras like drinks, snacks and eating out).

All the lodge houses have fully equipped self-catering kitchens, with all the necessities to cook a good meal. If you aren't feeling up to cooking on any particular day, the lodge also does meals that can be paid for on the day. For example, Thursday nights are pizza nights, and they also do BBQ's on regular occasions.
